

NOTICE OF RACE – 2006 DINGHIES@RYYC REGATTA (BLYTH PARK)

This Notice of Race refers to the following event and replaces any past notices.

Dinghies@RYYC Regatta held on 26th, 27th and 28th August 2006 at Blyth Park, Wilsthorpe, Bridlington

1. Organising Authority

The Organising Authority shall be the Royal Yorkshire Yacht Club.

2. Rules

The races will be governed by the ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing, the prescriptions of the RYA, the rules of each competing class, the sailing instructions and the local instructions.

3. Classes

Racing will be open to all classes holding a PY number (H/C class), Snipe, Swordfish, Enterprise and Dart 18.

4. Entries

Entries will be accepted at registration. Entry fees - Single handed crew £50, Two up crews £60 for the full Regatta. (Camping is included, plus evening meals Sat & Sun, entertainment & post race hot drinks).

5. Registration

Registration is from 10.30am on Saturday, briefing 11.30am on Saturday.

6. Races

The first race is scheduled to start at 13.00 on Saturday.

7. Certificates

All competing boats should hold a valid measurement certificate, which may be required to be shown at registration. All measurement issues should be addressed prior to the championships for individual classes.

8. Sailing Instructions

Sailing Instructions and Local Instructions will be available at registration, plus amendments thereafter as prescribed in the Sailing Instructions.

9. Safety

9.1 A boat is entirely responsible for her own safety, whether afloat or ashore, and nothing, whether in the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions or anywhere else reduces this responsibility.

9.2 It is for the boat to decide whether she is fit to sail in the conditions in which she will find herself. By launching or going to sea, the boat confirms that she is fit for those conditions and her crew is competent to sail and compete in them.

9.3 Nothing done by the organisers can reduce the responsibility of the boat nor will it make the organisers responsible for any loss, damage, death or personal injury, however it may have occurred, as a result of the boat taking part in the racing. The organisers encompass everyone helping to run the race and the event, and include the organising authority, the race committee, the race officer, patrol boats and beach masters.

9.4 The provision of patrol boats does not relieve the boat of her responsibilities.

9.5 Each boat is required to hold adequate insurance and in particular to hold insurance against third party claims in the sum of at least £2,000,000.

10. Boat park

10.1 Boats maybe left at Blyth Park the previous weekend by prior arrangement.

10.2 All boats (inc. club members' boats) to be parked on the beach, tractor/s available on Monday 28th.
